At Tried & True Labradors we understand that you are looking to purchase an exceptional English Labrador! In order to ensure the caliber of puppy that you are purchasing we have a health guarantee in place;

With the purchase of each pup, we are guaranteeing your puppy's elbows to be free from genetic dysplasia and to have an OFA (Orthopedic Foundation for Animals) rating of Fair, Good, or Excellent at 12 months old based on the official clearances of both the Sire and Dam or we will replace your puppy at that time.

Tried & True Labradors will NOT replace a puppy for any other injury to the dogs joints due to trauma or injury accrued after ownership to the client has taken place. **We highly recommend a potential T&TL client to do their part in preparing for the responsibility of a new puppy by checking out our resources page on our website to educate on the Do's and Dont's of raising a young pup.**

In the case that a puppy should receive an OFA rating other than the acceptable ratings listed above, Tried & True Labradors will then receive the dog back at that time to have the OFA tests confirmed by our veterinarian. Once confirmed by our veterinarian, Tried and True Labradors will regain full ownership of the dog to live a happy and successful life and the client will be refunded another puppy. A replacement puppy will not be refunded to the client until the original dog is returned the breeder.

We **NEVER** refund money but will provide you a new puppy **in exchange** for the one of underrated OFA score.

*As a disclaimer we like for our clients to know that Labrador Retriever is a breed that is susceptible to hip and elbow dysplasia which is why we emphasize the importance of responsible and educated breeding.
